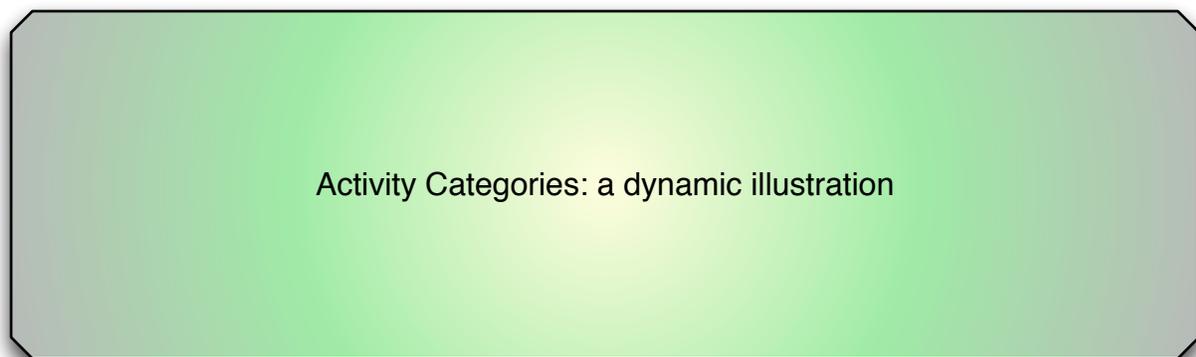

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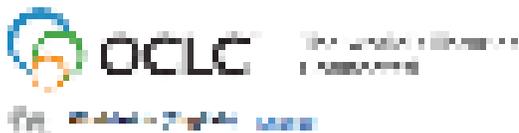

WorldMap

This is not a complete version of the WorldMap page. It is meant to be illustrative of an activity page. The key takeaway is that every activity has one (and only one) landing page. They should be constructed in a similar way. From here you can point off to prototypes (as this page does) or a collaborative "members-only" space as some other activities might. Software downloads, references, publications, and all the rest of the output of an activity should be referenced from the activity landing page.

The OCLC WorldMap is a prototype system that provides an interactive visual tool for selecting and displaying international library holdings represented in WorldCat, and publishing, library, cultural heritage, and collection data.

Why we developed this prototype

People can be inundated by an overwhelming amount of information. One method for organizing and retrieving geographically-based information is to use maps for data visualization.

Data such as those presented in this prototype can be used to provide information for decision making in regards to remote storage, collection management, marketing, and cooperative collection development, preservation, and digitization.

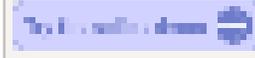
